Update on the M25 Voucher Scheme

The M25 Consortium has been operating a M25 Voucher Scheme, which some members have found a useful way of using funds in their current financial year training budget while retaining the allocation for the following year.

New voucher purchase deadline: 30 August 2024

Following consultation with members, we have made the decision to close the M25 Voucher Scheme. We recognise that some members will require time to prepare for the withdrawal of the scheme and may already have plans to purchase vouchers at the end of the current financial year. For the academic year 2024-25, new vouchers can be purchased up to **30 August 2024**. After this date, the Voucher Scheme will be closed to new purchases.

Existing vouchers must be used by 31 July 2025. From 1 August 2025, the M25 Voucher Scheme closes completely.

While the scheme remains open, you can use M25 Vouchers for:

- cpd25 training events
- Annual Conference delegate fees
- Leadership Briefings delegate fees
- Membership subscription
