

Membership of Task Groups is open to all staff in M25 member institutions, with Task Group members normally drawn from a cross-section of member institutions, job roles and levels.

Each Task Group meets online approximately 3-4 times per year, and there is an annual cpd25 planning event when topics are considered to inform the following academic year's programme planning.

TG2 is a group that provide training and development in areas such as equal opportunities, accessibility, disability, health and safety, copyright and data protection.

We always attempt to work on events in pairs or more, so newer members can work alongside those with more experience. Recently we have held events on 'Copyright essentials', 'The role of libraries in supporting refugees and asylum seekers', 'Licensing for overseas-based students', 'The Customer Service Excellence Standard: sharing hints and tips' and 'Deaf awareness training with Dot Sign Language'.

We have had visits to the Kew Gardens Library, HMP Wandsworth Library, the Aga Khan Library and the Imperial War Museum Library. Our upcoming visits include visits to the Francis Crick Institute, the Wellcome Collection Library, the Marx Memorial Library & Workers School, and the London Library.
