Diversity Group benefit from the M25's Innovation Fund

We are pleased to report that the M25's Diversity Group has been successful in its application to the M25 Innovation Fund.

This is a Fund that awards grants to successful applicants that meet the Fund's criteria and the M25 Consortium's aim to support all members in their personal, professional and institutional development through cooperative and collaborative endeavours. In its first pilot year of operation, applications were restricted to M25 Groups and Networks.

The Diversity Group will be using their Innovation Fund award to put on a high profile event to launch the results of a recent survey to consortium members and other interested parties. They will also offer bursary places and travel costs to enable people to be able to attend where cost might have been a barrier. By doing this, they aim to maximise the impact of the findings of their second Library diversity survey.

We wish the Diversity Group every success with this work and look forward to the relevant and thought-provoking event next year.

Deaf Awareness Training with Dot Sign Language

28 November 10.30am-1pm Online

There are still a few places available on our Deaf Awareness Online Training course presented by Dot Sign Language.

Dot's thought provoking and interactive online Deaf Awareness training sessions are great fun, providing attendees with the tools to improve interaction with deaf people internally and externally, breaking down communication barriers.

This session will cover discussions regarding the prevalence of deafness in the U.K, deaf issues, deaf culture and British Sign Language (BSL). They provide practical steps to help attendees actively promote engagement with BSL users ensuring accessibility, and their 'hands on' session in breakout rooms provides attendees the opportunity to learn basic fingerspelling and BSL relevant to your organisation.

Dot's teachers are all Deaf BSL users. They are the best people to teach their language and answer your questions from personal experience. They will teach the session in BSL – so you can immerse yourselves in sign language. They will provide an interpreter to voiceover the session and interpret your questions.
