Sustainability: Call Out for Members

M25 is looking for colleagues to join our new Sustainability Group, to support a major theme of the M25 Consortium of Academic Libraries' Strategy 2023-2026 - "Sustainability: Acting sustainably". This theme was formed in response to member needs around information sharing and best practice in this area.

Our current focus will be on environmental sustainability, however this will be reviewed by the Group and expanded to consider sustainability more broadly as needed, with economic, social and environmental sustainability interlinked. We are seeking a Chair, as well as members, who will be supported by Michelle Wake from the M25 Steering Group.

Key responsibilities for the M25 Sustainability Group:

- Regularly gather information from member institutions, and other relevant organisations, about sustainability initiatives, analyse responses and disseminate via reports and events.
- Provide opportunities for staff at member institutions to network and share initiatives, needs, and challenges around sustainability in London and the South.
- Provide an online toolkit of sustainability resources.
- Highlight guidance and recommendations of best practice.

Meetings will take place six times a year via Zoom. Guest speakers will contribute throughout the year.

cpd25 Task Group membership

cpd25 is currently seeking a new member to join <u>Task Group 2</u> and to contribute to the development and delivery of our programme on behalf of the M25 Consortium of Academic Libraries.

Membership of Task Groups is open to all staff in M25 member institutions, with Task Group members normally drawn from a cross-section of member institutions, job roles and levels.

Each Task Group meets online approximately three to four times per year, and there is an annual cpd25 planning event when topics are considered to inform the following academic year's programme planning.

Task Group 2 provides training and development in areas such as equal opportunities, accessibility, disability, health and safety, copyright and data protection.

We always attempt to work on events in pairs or more, so newer members can work alongside those with more experience. Recent events have included "Copyright essentials", "The role of libraries in supporting refugees and asylum seekers", "Licensing for overseas-based students", "The Customer Service Excellence Standard:



sharing hints and tips" and "Deaf awareness training with Dot Sign Language".
